3. MERMA Overview – Annual Report

Marcus Beverly and Matt Gowan provided a Draft Annual Report which provides an overview of MERMA history, coverage, services, financial condition and contact information. This is something that will be presented annually to Board Members and given to new members when they come on board. It will also be placed on MERMA's website once finalized.

G. FINANCIAL REPORTS

1. Draft Financial Statements for FYE 2019 and 2018

Patricia Kaufman and Jacinto Bernal presented the draft financial statements for fiscal years ending 2019 and 2018. Discussion held.

2. Investment Portfolio

Susanne King, Treasury Manager of Monterey County Treasurer-Tax Collector's Office introduced herself and stated that Allison Kaune of PFM who normally presents the annual Investment Portfolio Report to the Board just returned from maternity leave and Richard Babbe of PFM Asset Management will be presenting the report this year.

Richard Babbe reported that decreases in interest rates drove higher total returns for the year, as MERMA's investments increased in book value. PFM has increased the allocation to treasuries and corporates and decreased allocation to agencies. The portfolio is strategically positioned by extending the portfolio's duration to be in line with the benchmark's duration. Since inception the portfolio has performed very well and consistent with the benchmark and investment strategy of the portfolio, and PFM is continually looking for opportunities to increase the portfolio.

Susanne King stated she speaks with PFM almost daily and that Mary Zeeb, Treasurer Tax Collector of Monterey County, meets with PFM on a quarterly basis to go over strategy for both the County pool and the MERMA portfolio and to determine if any changes need to be made in the strategy.

3. Investment Policy

Marcus Beverly presented the updated Investment Policy with suggested minor revisions. He stated MERMA reviews and adopts the County's policy on an annual basis.

4. Financial Benchmark Performance

Marcus Beverly presented the estimated Balance Sheet as of June 30, 2019, and Profit and Loss Statement comparing FY 2018-19 and 2017-18 along with a Funding Policy Analysis PowerPoint presentation. Liabilities are going down and the Net Position is going up as a result. Claims liability has significantly decreased due to claims closing faster, closing claims by C&R, lower SIR and claims being managed better.

Marcus stated MERMA'S Net Position has increased \$5.7 million over the last fiscal year due to a decrease of \$2.8 million in claims liabilities and a decrease in loss adjustment expense.

Claim payments decreased and assets increased. Marcus stated MERMA is above its goal of a 1:1 ratio between Net Position and Expected Liabilities, something that that has been the hardest to achieve but perhaps the most conservative of MERMA's financial benchmarks.

Marcus stated MERMA has the option of declaring a dividend in FY 2019-20 and still remain above funding goals. Marcus stated he is looking conservatively at a potential dividend and recommends a range between \$1 million to \$3 million and would also like to discuss risk management or risk control suggestions that this money could be used for.

Discussion regarding options for an in-house Return to Work Specialist, Nurse Case Manager, telemedicine or contracting with a specific doctor or office. Marlene Richardson of Intercare stated South County districts don't have a lot of options for treatment. Would be nice to give them some more options. Also discussed risk management options as to what recent claims show where the risks are and requests from the districts for support.

Motion was made to approve \$1.5 million for dividend distribution and \$500,000 reserve for future data driven loss control measures.

Yvonne Perez stated she has concerns about the motion. She would like to know how MERMA is going to solve the issues with some of the rural areas where they can't get care. She would like to hear where we are going with that to solve that problem for those rural school districts and what it will cost to resolve these issues.

Song Chin-Bendib stated she felt that \$1.5 million was too much to be distributed back. She stated she would go for \$1 million.

H. JPA BUSINESS

3. Intercare Claims Management Stewardship Report

Connie Hampson of Intercare presented the annual Claims Management Stewardship Review for Fiscal Year 2019. She stated the report benchmarks the performance of the program over the last 3 years and looking for trends that we can focus on to make improvements in the program or areas where we have done a very good job and want to continue to do so.

Yvonne Perez and Colleen Stanley left the meeting.

- New indemnity claims are down 14.1%
- Total paid for first year claims decreased 9.1%
- Total paid all claims decreased 14.6%
- Total claims closed 659
- Bill Review Savings \$3,321,060 from the total medical charges
- Pharmacy Benefit Management Savings \$91,316
- Utilization Review Savings \$645,992
- Excess Recoveries received \$1,738,446
- Subrogation Recoveries received \$54,280
- Frequency Rate per 100 Employees is down 2.1%

Connie Hampson provided a handout that explains a program with Intercare, InterAid Triage and Telemedicine Program. Connie stated it is similar to Company Nurse, as we have our own Nurse Triage who refers directly to home care, telemedicine program or to receive medical treatment. This is an option that she wanted to present. She stated she has also reached out to her clients that have set up their own clinics and have ventured in that area for their input how they rolled it out, etc. We want to make sure your injured workers are taken care of as quickly as possible to get the medical care they need to get back to work as soon as possible.

Julio Jauregui, MERMA Loss Control Manager, presented an overview of his activity, services he provides and an update on the Matching Safety Funds program.
